

Technical Seminar on Sustainable Waste Management Policy and Implementation – Plastic Shopping Bag Charging and others in the pipeline



“The Hong Kong: Blueprint for Sustainable Use of Resources 2013-2022” was published by Environment Bureau in 2013. The blueprint targets to reduce the municipal solid waste (MSW) disposal rate through the HKSAR Government’s strategies, policies and actions in order to achieve a “Use less, Waste less” lifestyle.

MSW Charging and Producers Responsibility Schemes (PRS) are high priority initiatives of the Government’s waste management policies. Among which the bill on PRS of Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) will be introduced to the Legislative Council in March 2015, while the MSW charging and PRS on glass beverage bottles are in law drafting stage.

The HKSAR Government has implemented the Environmental Levy Scheme on Plastic Shopping Bags (the Levy Scheme) in 2009. These primarily include chain or large supermarkets, convenience stores, personal health and beauty stores, department stores, drug stores, etc. As a matter of fact, the number of plastic shopping bags has been reduced significantly by 80% to 90% since its implementation in those registered retail

outlets. For the purpose of extending the Levy Scheme to adopt a maximum coverage to include all retails of good in the territory irrespective of the scale of the business and the nature of the business, which is estimated at over 100,000 outlets, the Product Eco-responsibility (Amendment) Bill 2013 was passed by the Legislative Council in March 2014 and the Full Implementation of the Plastic Shopping Bag Charging will come into effect on 1 April 2015.

To provide more detail information of these new government initiatives, Hong Kong Green Strategy Alliance (HKGSA) and Hong Kong Waste Management Association (HKWMA), together with several professional organizations are going to host a technical seminar to discuss on these matters.

Ir Dr Alain Lam's presentation will outline the key waste challenges facing Hong Kong and explain how the Government's strategy on producer responsibility will contribute to the achievement of the committed waste reduction target.</i></p>
